

With William Shakespeare, David Hume and Arthur Schopenhauer as his mentors, and modern sages like Warren Buffett, George Soros and Charlie Munger guiding his actions, Carmell speaks from a point of success — a nearly 30-year investing career. Understanding the economic landscape helped Carmell grow his real estate investment and management firm, CWS Capital Partners LLC, from assets of USD250 million in the late 1980s to more than USD3 billion today. The company even averaged annual returns exceeding 13 percent during the Great Recession. Carmell combines his financial and life experiences — including nearly losing his 2-year-old son to a stroke — to create innovative strategies to help readers become wealthy in finance and life. 




Michael Fertik (YPO SF Bay, YPO Intercontinental), chief executive of Reputation.com, the largest online reputation






Leaders without followers can't drive change. "rEvolution" is the story of one leader's transformation from a first-time chief

Presidents' Organization) is a comingof-age novel that tells the story of Adam Craig, a 40-year-old stock trader in Chicago, Illinois, USA. With his marriage on the rocks and his life seemingly at a dead end, Craig listens to his therapist and travels to his childhood family compound on Black Bear Lake with hopes of making peace with his past. There, he relives painful memories from the summer of 1983, his last summer at the lake. Craig, only 15 that summer, witnesses his mother's declining health as she battled cancer and observes his cousin's depression from her parent's bitter divorce. The swirl of emotions during that month force Craig to realize the fine line between self-preservation and family, all the while unaware of the impending tragedy that will change his life forever.





When Claire Thomsen, daughter of **Greg Thomsen** (WPO City of Angels), was just 11, her parents

announced they were taking her out of school and disrupting her comfortable life in Malibu, California, USA, to travel the world for a year. "Girl Disrupted" is the product of that adventure and a memoir of how one young girl can change the world.
